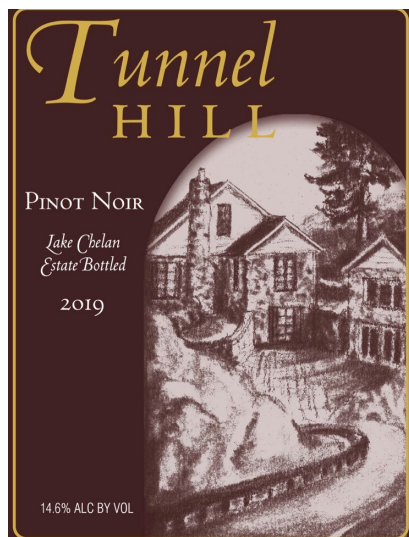




TUNNEL HILL WINERY

Cherries, red raspberry and cloves are accented by notes of tobacco and white pepper. A hint of acid on mid-palate gives way to a soft finish with moderate tannins and notes of cherry, allspice and leather.

ABOUT TUNNEL HILL WINERY

Founded in 2001, Tunnel Hill Winery continues a multi-generational farming tradition in the Lake Chelan Valley. Farmed as orchards by the Evans family since 1969, the grounds have been patiently transformed to feature 10 acres of grapes including plantings of Pinot Noir, Syrah, Riesling, Viognier, Malbec and Cabernet Sauvignon. Our stone tasting room was constructed in 1937 with stone blasted from the construction of Knapp's Hill Tunnel in 1934.



MICHELLE FANTON

Winemaker and Manager, Michelle Fanton, joined Tunnel Hill Winery in 2011. Originally from Seattle, she is a graduate of Cornell University and spent 11 years studying and making wine on the east coast in New York's Finger Lakes region before returning to Washington. Michelle philosophy is that a winemaker's job is to showcase the fruit, not dominate it and to allow the character of the region where the wines are produced to shine through.



DENNY & JACLYN EVANS

Owners Denny and Jaclyn Evans began Tunnel hill Winery in 2004 and are both actively involved in its day to day operation. Denny spent his entire life living and farming in North Central Washington and got his start farming pears in Leavenworth, WA. He began farming apples in Chelan in 1969 and shortly after started a roadside fruit stand to sell his fruit directly to customers, creating the Sunshine Farm Market. Denny has transferred his know-how and perfectionism to the diligent management of our Estate vineyards and has been raising award-winning fruit on the South Shore of Lake Chelan for over 50 years.
